Archbishop Miller: Masks Required at Mass

Please be reminded that per [Archbishop Miller's August 25th instruction](#), masks are required at Mass:

"I regard it as prudent that, as in all other indoor gatherings in BC, the wearing of masks will be required when attending Mass in the churches of the Archdiocese of Vancouver.

All other parish gatherings indoors, such as meetings, prayer groups, PREP, etc., are covered by the BC mask mandate, and all those aged 12 and older must wear masks."

"Simbang Gabi" is a tradition unlike any other. A Christmas Marian Novena of Masses, "Simbang Gabi" is a nine-day devotion that honours the Annunciation, the expectation of the Blessed Virgin Mary, and culminating in the birth of Jesus. Centered on the Eucharist, it is a combination of deep prayer, community spirit, reconciliation, hope, love, and the grateful recognition of our redemption. We invite all faithful to celebrate this Promise of Salvation, by attending the Nine-Day Novena Masses ("Simbang Gabi").

Simbang Gabi Novena and Masses begin on December 15th, continuing until December 23rd.

Archbishop's Mass for Life

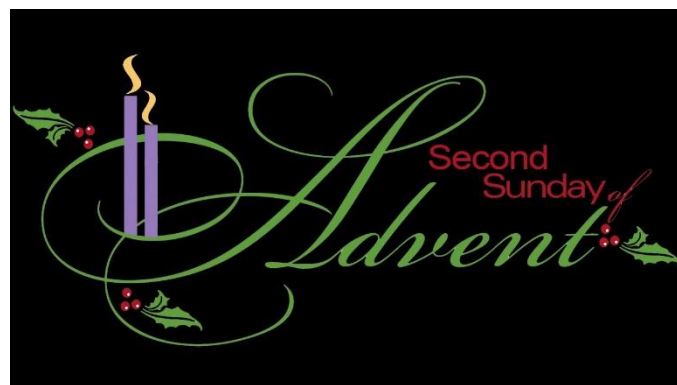
