

THE PRESENTATION OF THE LORD

The Feast of the Presentation, celebrated on February 2, is one of the major feasts in the church year. It is sometimes known as Candlemas or the Feast of the Purification. This feast is celebrated forty days after Christmas and commemorates the presentation of Jesus and the purification of Mary in the Jerusalem temple

The name “Candlemas” focuses attention on the candlelight procession that is a part of the liturgy. You are invited to bring candles in to be blessed at the Mass. Please bring them in and leave them in the Gathering Area in the basket provided.

The candlelight is an outward and visible sign of Christ who illumines our heart and inner being.
