<sup>2</sup> I will say of the LORD, "He is my refuge and my fortress, my God, in whom I trust."

<sup>3</sup> Surely he will save you from the fowler's snare and from the deadly pestilence.

<sup>4</sup>He will cover you with his feathers, and under his wings you will find refuge;

his faithfulness will be your shield and rampart.

<sup>5</sup> You will not fear the terror of night, nor the arrow that flies by day,

<sup>6</sup> nor the pestilence that stalks in the darkness,

nor the plague that destroys at midday.

<sup>7</sup> A thousand may fall at your side,

ten thousand at your right hand, but it will not come near you.

<sup>8</sup> You will only observe with your eyes and see the punishment of the wicked.

<sup>9</sup> If you say, "The LORD is my refuge," and you make the Most High your dwelling,

no harm will overtake you, no disaster will come near your tent.

<sup>11</sup> For he will command his angels concerning you

to guard you in all your ways;

12 they will lift you up in their hands,
so that you will not strike your foot
against a stone.

<sup>13</sup>You will tread on the lion and the cobra:

you will trample the great lion and the serpent.

<sup>14</sup> "Because he<sup>[b]</sup> loves me," says the LORD, "I will rescue him;

I will protect him, for he acknowledges my name.

<sup>15</sup> He will call on me, and I will answer him;

I will be with him in trouble, I will deliver him and honor him.

<sup>16</sup> With long life I will satisfy him and show him my salvation."


