To Honourable Adrian Dix, BC Minister of Health

Dear Minister Dix,

On behalf of the over 12,000 members of the British Columbia Knights of Columbus State Council, I applaud you and Dr. Bonnie Henry for your efforts on the overall safety and associated communication of the current pandemic we are in. British Columbia is one of the Canadian leaders in the per capita amount of Covid-19 cases thanks to your leadership on this.

As members of the Catholic church however, we do have a deep concern on the logic of keeping pubs, gyms, restaurants, etc., open while closing our churches. The Knights of Columbus along with other Catholic families, and I'm quite sure many other faith denominations are seeking clarity and understanding of this decision.

When we were allowed to have 50 people in our churches last year, my church was extremely cautious in distancing and sanitation. I (we) can not understand that at the minimum, we can't go back to that model.

I have to ask the question, "Were there any known cases of spread in the churches that were following the protocols?" I have not heard Dr. Henry mention any in her updates. Please correct me if I am wrong. The big spread of Covid-19 that seems to be occurring presently is the communty spread by young adults. Why penalize the faithful?

I (we) look forward to a response to my questions either in writing or via your daily updates.
