

Local Pilgrimage Sites

Clarification on Holy Doors during the Jubilee of Hope

The Archdiocese of Vancouver has received many inquiries regarding Holy Doors during the Jubilee Year of Hope.

This Jubilee Year, Pope Francis has designated Holy Doors exclusively at the four major papal basilicas in Rome to highlight the unity of the universal Church and to invite Catholics worldwide to make the traditional pilgrimage to Rome. There are no Holy Doors in Vancouver, though Catholics can still obtain the Jubilee Indulgence by following the instructions below.

How to receive Jubilee Indulgence
During the Jubilee Year 2025, you can receive a
plenary indulgence in the Archdiocese of
Vancouver (the complete remission of the
temporal punishment of sin), by completing the
following:

- 1. Detachment from sin (even venial)
- 2. Visit a Jubilee Pilgrimage site:
 - Holy Rosary Cathedral, Downtown Vancouver
 - St. Jude's Parish and Shrine, East Vancouver
 - St. Anthony of Padua Parish and Shrine of Santo Niño de Cebu, Agassiz
 - Or another site dedicated by Pope Francis or the local Bishop
- 3. Attend Holy Mass or any of the following, ideally at the pilgrimage site:
 - · Celebration of the Word of God
 - Liturgy of the Hours
 - · Way of the Cross
 - Rosary
 - Penitential Celebration with individual confession
 - Confession at the same time or at least within about 20 days of visiting a pilgrimage site
- 4. Pray for the Pope
 - Our Father, Hail Mary etc.

The plenary indulgence is available until December 28, 2025.

Father Rey Usman, Pastor of Precious Blood Parish in Surrey, invites you to this once in a lifetime Marian pilgrimage on the Year of the Jubilee, starting in Rome, Italy and visiting the major basilicas and going through the Holy Doors. Other places to be visited are the churches in Assisi and Padua, Venice, and Turin. We visit also shrine of Our Lady of Montserrat, Sagrada Familia, Our Lady of the Pilar in Barcelona and Zaragoza, Spain. Spend two nights at the shrine of Our Lady of Lourdes in France, and continue to Salamanca and to Portugal, arriving at Fatima on the eve of the feast of Our Lady of Fatima. This pilgrimage concludes with a one-day guided sightseeing tour of Lisbon before heading back to Vancouver.

Finance Council Report on Parking Lot Upgrade

Our parish has been saving for this parking lot project since 2014. Additional funds, in the amount of \$25,000 were contributed by the Sto. Niño de Cebu Shrine.

Prior to the beginning of construction, our Finance Council approved a budget for \$250,000. This was also approved by Archbishop Miller.

The project is now completely paid for, and here is a breakdown of the costs:

Sam's Construction: \$145,007.78 Grandview Blacktop: \$93,987.84 Tri-Volt Electric: \$6,444.90 Everline Coatings: \$2,100.00 Total Expenditure: \$247,540.52 Less GST Rebate: (\$5893.82)

Total: \$241,647.00

Gospel Reflection for the 6th Sunday of Easter

Parting is such sweet sorrow

Having experienced the pain and sorrow of the crucifixion, then the joy and new life of the resurrection, the followers of Jesus now have to face the reality of the Risen Lord's departure – again. He senses their confusion, pain and sense of loss. But before he leaves them, he gives those two parting gifts; The Holy Spirit and his own Peace.

He doesn't give them all the answers to the questions they have. He knows that they will have to face difficulties, disagreements and differences. So he prepares them for the road ahead by strengthening and encouraging them with His risen life through the gifts of the Holy Spirit and his own inner Peace. He is sending them out to proclaim the good news, but he does not expect them to do it on their own.

Encouraged by His presence they will never be alone or helpless and neither are we, who are the community of believers today. We are asked to face our daily reality and lives not just with optimism but with faith and hope in the risen Jesus and each other.
